### Dear Friends,

GSI is proud that the UN elected <u>Ecuador Foreign Minister Maria Fernanda Espinosa</u> to be the incoming President of the UN General Assembly. She will become the 73rd person, and the fourth woman ever, to hold the UNGA presidency.

Sra Espinosa is a former Defense Minister, Ambassador to the UN in Geneva and an accomplished poet, having published five volumes of poetry and receiving the Ecuadorian National Poetry Prize in 1990.

Sra Espinosa has also been a long-time advocate for peace, human rights, nuclear disarmament and environmental protection. She serves as a Council Member of the influential World Future Council, and has partnered in a number of events and initiatives with key international peace and disarmament organisations including Abolition 2000, Basel Peace Office, UNFOLD Zero, and GSI's Parliamentarians for Nuclear Nonproliferation and Disarmament.

During her term as Ecuador Ambassador to the UN in Geneva, for example, she co-hosted a number of nuclear disarmament events with these NGOs at the UN, including some of the annual commemoration events for the International Day for the Total Elimination of Nuclear Weapons.

At the 2015 commemoration event for the International Day, Sra Espinosa presented " A Nuclear-Weapon-Free World: Our Common Good," a joint statement of religious leaders, mayors and parliamentarians to the United Nations.

Ms. Espinosa has also been the Coordinator of the project "Political Dialogues for Sustainable Development in Latin America;" served as Environmental Adviser for UNICEF on environmental and girls' education in Niger; worked as Liaison Officer on forest-related indigenous knowledge; and focused on intellectual property rights at the Intergovernmental Panel on Forests at the United Nations.

In addition to being a poet, Sra. Espinosa is an accomplished academic, having published more than 30 academic articles on the Amazon River, culture, heritage, development, climate change, intellectual property, foreign policy, integration, defence and security.



# PNND in the News: PNND at the 12th Annual International Conference on Overseas Development Aid



'Imagine if nuclear weapons were used on the Korean Peninsula, either by the DPRK or the United States. The devastation to humans, infrastructure and the environment would likely be catastrophic even if it were only one or two nukes detonated,' said Alyn Ware, keynote speaker at the 12th Seoul International Conference on Overseas Development Aid, which was cohosted by the Korean Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Korea International Cooperation Agency (KOICA).

The conference was opened by CHO Hyun, Vice-Minister of Foreign Affairs, and presided over by LEE Mikyung, President of KOICA and former PNND Co-President. Jeffrey Sachs, Special adviser on SDGS to the UN Secretary-General, was one of the other international speakers. Alyn Ware, Global Coordinator of PNND, delivered the keynote address.

'Peace is one of the five key principles - the five Ps - of the Sustainable Development Goals,' said LEE Mikyung in her opening remarks, 'the other four being economic Prosperity, protecting the Planet, putting People at the centre of policy, and ensuring inclusion and Partnership of all stakeholders.'(Continued)
