In October of 2001, the Security Council urged all Member States "to ensure increased representation of women at all decision-making levels in national, regional and international institutions and mechanisms for the prevention, management, and resolution of conflict."

On the occasion of the 62nd sessions of the General Assembly First and Third Committees and the upcoming anniversary of the Security Council's recognition of the role of women in achieving peace and security (SC Resolution 1325), the Global Security Institute and the Parliamentary Network for Nuclear Disarmament is convening parliamentarians, diplomats and committed, concerned citizens in a special panel event on October 11th, to amplify their shared message of ridding the world of nuclear weapons.

The esteemed women on this panel are each leaders in their own different constituencies-- be they legislative, diplomatic or from the citizenry/grassroots field. They will discuss how to

enhance the prospects for nuclear abolition by embracing a wider network of related constituencies and issues, including sustainable development, human rights, the environment and the promotion of a culture of peace. Through their leadership, they are living embodiments of the principles enshrined in SCR 1325: women working at all levels to prevent the worst conflict of all-- one in which nuclear weapons are used.
